NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURES

NOMINATION AND APPLICATION PERIODS

FALL SEMESTER:

- Nomination: March 1st March 31st, 2022
- Application: April 1st April 30th, 2022

SPRING SEMESTER:

- Nomination: September 19th October 14th, 2022
- Application: October 17th November 11th, 2022

NOMINATION PROCESS Partner universities will receive a short online nomination form to be filled out once per nominated student

APPLICATION PROCESS Nominated students will directly receive by e-mail instructions on how to apply. They will be asked to submit an online application form with an ID photo, a photocopy of their passport/national ID and a French language test or certificate.

Additional documents for students interested in taking courses from Inalco's Professional Tracks:

- CV (written in French or in English)
- Cover Letter (written in French)
- English language test/certificate (minimum B2)

Please note that the minimum French proficiency requirement is C1 for Professional Track courses.



GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT COURSES

Exchange students can select courses from **three different categories**, according to their individual needs and French proficiency levels. Please note that **all courses are taught in French**.

Language and Civilisation courses – French B1 level achieved

This block of courses refers to teaching in languages area studies

Professional Track courses – French C1 level achieved (+B2 in English)

- International Trade
- International Relations
- Intercultural Communication
- Language Didactics
- Texts, Informatics and Multilingualism

Please note that access to Inalco's Professional Track courses is competitive and subject to final approval from an admission committee.

French Language courses (Inal'FLE) - no minimum, full beginners accepted

Inalco offers French as a Foreign Language courses. All proficiency levels are available from A1 (full beginner) to C1 (advanced)

Please note that a French language test will be sent to incoming students before their arrival at Inalco. Its results will determine the group level to which the student will be registered at Inalco, regardless of other results from DELF/DALF exams.

- A full semester workload is 30 ECTS.
- The grades scale ranges from 0 to 20, 10 being the minimum grade to pass a module.

TRANSCRIPTS Transcripts will be sent to students by e-mail 3 weeks after the end of the exchange program.

ACCEPTED LANGUAGE TESTS

- DELF/DALF
- Certificate issued by your home university stating your level of French and/or English language

HOUSING

Inalco is generally able to provide exchange students with student housing in external residences (CIUP/CROUS/ALJT), just a short distance away from Inalco. Prices range from €370 to €550. Please note that housing cannot be guaranteed, however.

Students wishing to apply for one of these residences must include this information in their online application form.

HEALTH INSURANCE

<u>EU students</u>: EU students must get a valid **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)**, covering them during their whole stay in France. For a full coverage, it is recommended to subscribe to **additional health insurance**.

Non-EU students:

- Non-EU students **must get, before departure, an international health insurance** covering them during their whole stay in France.
- In addition to this international health insurance, it is highly recommended to register to the French Social Security (free of charge): <u>https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/</u>

<u>VISA</u>

- EU students do not need a visa.
- Non-EU students will have to apply for a visa: please contact the nearest French Embassy or Consulate to get all the corresponding details.
